Notice of Rate Change

The Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (PUC) has approved a mid-year adjustment to the transition portion of our customer's monthly electric bills that will result in lower charges.

Currently, the transition charge appears as a credit each month on bills for residential and large commercial and industrial customers. It remains a charge for small businesses.

Beginning July 26, the transition credit will increase for residential and large commercial and industrial customers. The transition charge will decrease for small businesses.

The effect of these changes on your total electric bill depends on your rate schedule and the amount of electricity you use. As a result of these changes, the average residential customer's electric bill will decrease from \$137.34 to \$133.61.

The monthly bill for a commercial customer who uses 1,000 kilowatt-hours of electricity with a maximum demand of 3 kilowatts will decrease from \$141.24 to \$140.08. The total bill for an industrial customer using 150,000 kwh with a maximum demand of 500 kw would decrease from \$15,745.91 to \$15,520.45.

The mid-year adjustment supports the scheduled termination of the transition charge by Dec. 31, 2010.
