



PPL REFRIGERATOR RECYCLE PROGRAM

- WHAT: Recycle your refrigerator and your local Boy Scouts receive \$50. PPL Electric Utilities currently offers a \$50 rebate and free recycling services to residential electric customers in Pennsylvania, for turning in your old, or second, fridge (or freezer). While the program lasts, you have the opportunity to donate that rebate check to your local Boy Scouts. Hurry, \$50 offer valid until December 30, 2012.
- WHY: Frequently, customers are unaware of the full cost of running old appliances (3 to 4 times the energy use of newer models), and then there is the inconvenience of disposal. This Refrigerator Recycling Program helps residential electric customers like yourself save money on energy costs through reduced energy use and helps the environment through proper disposal of the discarded appliances (95% of the appliance materials are recycled). And if you choose to donate your rebate check to your local Boy Scouts you will be helping the most important thing of all, our **children**!
- HOW: You can make your appointment by calling 1-877-270-3522 or visiting www.pplelectric.com/e-power. You must be sure to indicate whether or not you will be donating your rebate to the Boy Scouts when making your appointment. Your refrigerator is then verified for Program eligibility and you will be given a confirmation code for the appliance removal. The Boy Scouts will receive a \$50 check within 4-6 weeks of unit pick up date.

WHERE: PPL Electric Utilities service territory in Pennsylvania.

Appliance Eligibility Requirements

- Both refrigerators and stand-alone freezers are eligible
- Units must be 10-30 cubic feet in size
- Units must be working
- Units must be at a PPL Electric Utility service account location
