CREATE YOUR PLAN

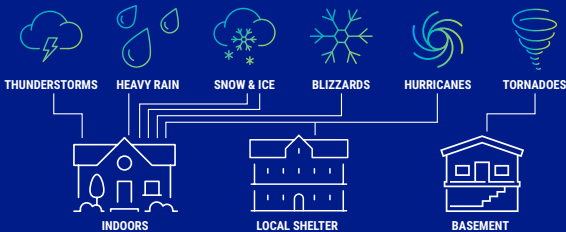
60% of Americans don't have an emergency plan.

Keep a hard copy of your contacts' information in case your cell phone loses its charge.

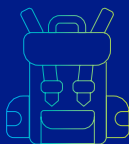
BUILD YOUR EMERGENCY KIT
